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VIRTUAL FAIR HIGHLIGHTS

112 and 150 U.S. universities participated in the graduate and undergraduate virtual fair respectively, the highest ever number of U.S. Higher Education Institutions to participate in a single event of this nature in the region.

From Karnataka, students logged in from 14 Tier II and III cities. The fairs have helped reaffirm the high level of interest that students and parents have for pursuing higher studies in the U.S. The annual EducationUSA fair is a bridge to connect U.S. institutions to local student markets, particularly in areas with limited access and to help students identify the right colleges and courses for them.

At the undergraduate fair, Bangalore ranks first from within India and the fifth highest as a city across South Asia. Overall, the virtual fair was successful in helping us reach out to a wider base within the state and create a credible platform to facilitate interactions between students and U.S. higher education institutions.
